JPMorgan Chase Corporate Challenge



On May 24, 2014 Jim's Bridge provided 46 volunteers at the JP Morgan Chase Corporate Challenge 3.5 mile run. On a beautiful evening in Grant Park, our volunteers managed the Start Corrals, provided post-start cleanup and assisted at a water stop. Over 25,000 people participated in the race. The volunteers received a T-Shirt and pre-race pizza.

Rock N Roll Half Marathon



On the warm morning of July 21, 2014, our volunteers handed out "cold sponges to hot runners". They were stationed after the 11 mile marker on the 13.1 mile course. The volunteers received volunteer shirts, a drawstring bag and a souvenir towel.

Rock the Night 5K



Stormy skies held off as our 28 volunteers managed the start corrals for this 5k race by Soldier Field on August 21, 2014. After the start, our volunteers enjoyed hot dogs, burgers and roasted corn on the cob, served on a take home frisbee.

The Bank of America Chicago Marathon

Eighty-six volunteers from Jim's Bridge provided runner information in Grant Park on the crisp fall morning of October 12, 2014. Over 40,000 runners participated in the marathon. Volunteers received a Chicago marathon volunteer jacket and cap.



The Hot Chocolate 5K/15K



It was a brisk morning in Grant Park on Nov 9, 2014, as 31 volunteers from Jim's Bridge provided runner information to nearly 40,000 participants in the Hot Chocolate 5K/15K.

Our volunteers were rewarded with delicious Hot Chocolate fondue, hot chocolate drinks and an awesome hoodie for their services.

The Schools We Support



Visitation School

The James F. Mikulski Memorial Group awards scholarships to students at Visitation Catholic School. Award recipients are recommended by the school's administration, based on financial need and good academic standing. "Vis" serves the Englewood and Back of the Yards areas on the South Side of Chicago. Visitation welcomes all children regardless of race, creed, color or national origin.

Our charity also provides financial support for programs and activities at the school which enrich the education and well-being of the students.

In Spring 2014, we were delighted to underwrite the expenses for the annual Visitation "Hoops" Tournament.



This intramural basketball tournament runs from January through March and is open to all students in Grades 2 – 8

Our charity provided transportation funding for trips to each of Chicago's zoos. The charity funded Urban Gateways programs which brought Art music and Dance workshops to the school.

We covered the expenses for the Academic Awards Ceremony at the end of the 2013-2014, where three Visitation students were presented scholarships for the upcoming 2014-2015 academic year from Jim's Bridge.



St. Gall School

Thanks to our very generous donors and the work of our volunteers, the James F. Mikulski Memorial Group has extended its scholarship program to include St. Gall Catholic School on the Southwest Side of Chicago, which primarily serves a Hispanic community.

As with Visitation, scholarship recipients are recommended by the school's administration based on financial need and good academic standing.

In November, 2014, Executive Directors Maureen and John Mikulski were proud to present scholarships to four children at St. Gall.

Our Name and Logo

The James F. Mikulski Memorial Group is the name under which we incorporated in the State of Illinois as a Charitable Organization. We chose this name to clearly reflect our commitment to establishing a legacy of caring and service in Jim's memory. For those of you who knew Jim, he was always happy to help and would go the extra mile to make sure things were done very well.

There are many ways to establish a legacy of caring and service. Our focus is on serving future generations by supporting grade school children from low-income families within the Chicago area. We also encourage others to help further this mission through volunteer work or financial support.

To create an easily recognizable name, and as a symbol to the goals of our charity, we have adopted the name "Jim's Bridge to a Brighter Future" and created this logo, which is now used on our business materials and correspondence.

IRS Tax Exempt Status

We are happy to announce that the James F. Mikulski Memorial Group received approval from the IRS as a Tax Exempt 501(c)(3) Charitable Organization, retroactive to its incorporation date of January 13, 2014. This means that your donation is fully tax deductible to

the extent allowed by law. Beginning with our incorporation in 2014, a tax exempt acknowledgement letter has been sent to each donor within two weeks of the donation. Managing the Charity Expenses

No salary or financial compensation is provided to those managing and directing the charity: all of that work is completely voluntary. Our operating/expense ratio this year was less than 7%.
